interest and all other claims come into his hands, either in the whole or in part, and then upon this further trust, that so soon after the happening of such default of payment is made, all the said tract of land and premises, with its appurtenances, together with the aforesaid slaves, and the increase thereof and all the other personal property hereby conveyed, or such part of the hereby granted premises, as the testator shall think sufficient for the purpose, and shall think proper to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction, after having fixed the time and place of sale at his own discretion and given ten days notice thereof, and also notified the same by advertisement, to be set up at the door of the Courthouse of Southampton County or some Court day previous to the day of sale, and out of the monies arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the premises, pay to the said A.S. Burgess his executors, administrators or assigns the said sum of Twenty five hundred dollars with the interest thereon and all other claims come into his hands, and the balance if any, shall pay to the said Joseph Gardner his heirs executors, administrators or assigns, that is to say of the whole of the aforesaid debt and debt be fully paid off and discharged to the said A.S. Burgess his heirs executors, administrators or assigns. So that as default of payment of the aforesaid debt be made, the this indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue. BE IT WITNESSED all men by these presents that I James Britt of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Mary Britt of the County aforesaid, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Mary Britt her executors administrators and assigns all my right title and interest in the slaves and their increase and the other property conveyed by Nathan Britt to his wife the said Mary and their children by a certain deed bearing date the 26th day of October and recorded in the County Court of Southampton the 19th day of November 1821. likewise one Sowel house and two cows. To have and to hold my interest in the slaves & other property in the deed above referred to convey, together with the Sowel house & two cows aforesaid unto her the said Mary Britt her executors and assigns against myself the said James Britt and against the claim title or demand of all and every person or persons whomsoever.
