This Indenture made the 14th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty three between Robert Raiford and Mary Raiford his wife of the one part and Mordicai Bradshaw of the other part, all of the County of Southampton & State of Va. Witnesseth: That the said Robert Raiford and Mary Raiford his wife in consideration of the sum of Eighteen dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Mordicai Bradshaw at or before the making & delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Mordicai Bradshaw his heirs &c a certain parcel of land, containing by estimation ten acres more or less and bounded as follows Viz^d Commencing with a pine corner tree at the road adjoining the land which the said Mordicai Bradshaw lately purchased of Johnson Raiford running a line of marked trees to another pine corner tree joining the land of said Mordicai Bradshaw running from thence a line of marked trees to a dog wood corner tree at the road, the road then being the line to the first named tree above together with all the singular houses out houses buildings yards gardens or chards lands, tenements meadows, pastures, fishing commons, woods, ways, waters, water courses, privileges, profits, commodities, advantages, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said parcel of land belonging or appertaining or with the same used and enjoyed or accepted, reputed taken or known as part parcel or member thereof or as belonging to the same or any part thereof (and the remains & remainders, yearly and other rents, issues & profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof).
