This Indenture made this fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and forty three (1843) between Josiah D.M. Delk of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part, and John R. Briggs of the County
State aforesaid of the second part and Joseph Brutton of the County of Surry and State
of Virginia of the third part witnesseth that whereas the said Josiah D.M. Delk became
indebted to Mr. A. K. Bell by bond with Joseph Brutton security executed this fourteenth day
of January in year aforesaid to the amount of Fifty eight dollars & fifty one cents of law-
ful money of this Commonwealth for the purpose of securing the said Joseph Brutton
and in Consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said John R. Briggs at
or before the insuring or delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl-
edged by the said Josiah D.M. Delk, hath granted, bargained and sold and by these
presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said John R. Briggs a certain female
negro slave named Charlotte, together with her future increase, and all the estate, right
titles and interest of said Josiah D.M. Delk in and to the said granted or intended
to buy and to hold the same granted mentioned to be hereby granted ^{for} ~~for~~
to be hereby granted Slave, and her future increase, thereof unto the John R. Briggs his
heirs executors, administrators and assigns, forever upon special trust notwithstanding the
said John R. Briggs should be called upon to pay the above mentioned debt, then
and in that case it shall be lawful for the said John R. Briggs after giving ten days
previous notice of the time and place of such sale to proceed to sell for cash the above
mentioned slave, and after discharging the above mentioned debt, with interest, acom-
mon, and all reasonable expenses of such sale to pay the overplus, if any, to the said
Josiah D.M. Delk or his legal representative. In witness whereof we have hereunto affixed
