This Indenture made this 28th day of October in the year of our Lord 1842 Between Edith Bradshaw of one part and Benjamin Griffen of the other part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia; witnesseth that the said Edith Bradshaw for an consideration of the sum of fifty dollars of lawful money of Virginia to her in hand paid by the said Benj Griffen at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Have bargained and sold, and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Benj Griffen his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land and premises containing by estimation twenty five acres be the same more or less, and bounded as followeth, beginning at a pine a corner tree of corner tree of Willis Bradshaws land, thence a line of marked trees west course to a pine another corner of said land & Willis Bradshaws thence the said Bradshawe line near the house where the said Edith Bradshawe lived to a gum in the Old pond branch a corner of said land and a strait line of Willis Bradshaw and Benj Griffen thence a line of marked trees between the said Edith Bradshaw & Benj Griffen to a post oak a corner a corner of said land & Benj Griffen then in the said Griffens line to the beginning together with all and singular the houses out houses edifices buildings yards gardens orchards land & tenement, wood, ways waters and water courses profits, commodities advantages hereditaments & appurtenances what soever to the said land belonging, or in any way appertaining to the same or any part or parcel or thereof, to have and to hold the said twenty five acres of land more or less with all and singular the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold, and every part and parcel thereof unto the said Benjamin Griffen his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Edith Bradshawe for herself her heirs the said tract or parcel of land unto the said Benjamin Griffen his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of her the said Edith Bradshawe and her heirs, and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents.
