negro boy Simeon and girl Martha, to have and to hold to his proper use and behoof forever upon trust nevertheless that the said Henry Kindred shall by the request of either party after giving reasonable notice of the time and place, expose to public sale, the property above named or somuch thereof as will satisfy the above named debt, and interest and out of the proceeds so first pay the expenses thereof then pay the debt and interest aforesaid, and the balance payed over to the said Henry Joyner or his legal representative, and the said Henry Joyner covenants with the said Henry Kindred that he is possessed of an absolute fee simple right in the property above conveyed, and that he will furnish warrant and defend the same against himself and all other persons whatsoever. This Indenture made this 5th day of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty two between George Gay of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and John R Briggs of said County of the second part & Robt Buttlow of said County of the third part. Nowtly that whereas the said George Gay became indebted to the said J. R. Buttlow by bond executed this 5th day of November 1842 to the amount of one hundred and fifty four dollars and 23 cents for value received of them and in consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said J. R. Buttlow at or before the sealing & delivery of these presents the rest whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said George Gay hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said John R. Briggs two certain negroes Evertt aged about six years, and girl Margaret aged about four years to have and to hold the said negroes herein mentioned to be hereby granted unto the said John R. Briggs his heirs executors, administrators and assigns forever upon special trust. Nowtly if the said John R. Briggs should be called on to make the money then and in that case it shall be lawful for the said John R. Briggs after giving ten days previous notice of the time and place of such sale proceed to sell for cash the abovementioned or mentioned slaves and after discharging the above mentioned debt with interest and all reasonable expenses of such sale pay the overplus if any to the said George Gay or his legal representative.
