 the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand dollars, to them  
 in hand paid by the said Richard Porter before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the  
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and conveyed and by  
 these presents, do grant, bargain sell and convey unto the said Porter his heirs and assigns a  
 certain tract or parcel of land, situated in the County of Southampton (and bounded by the land  
 of Richard Porter, John C. Turner, Nathaniel Francis and others; containing 42.6 acres more  
 or less, being the land, formerly belonging to Robert H. Reese dec<sup>d</sup>. and from whom the grantors  
 hereof the land together with all the privileges and appurtenances to the said land in any  
 wise appertaining and belonging. To have and to hold the above granted premises to  
 the said Richard Porter his heirs and assigns forever. And the said John W. Reese, Martha  
 J. his wife, Mark J. Peete, and Chery T. his wife and Arthur J. Reese, for and in behalf of their  
 heirs, Executors and administrators, do covenant, with the said Richard Porter, his heirs and
