

541.00 Due Dear 25/1842, and whereas the said Genry hath become bound with the said Benjamin Cobb in a bond executed to William D. Edwards on the 14th day of June 1843 for the sum of fifty four dollars 24.00 with interest thereon from date and the said Benj^r Cobb being willing and desirous to secure and save the said Genry from all legal, have in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Samuel Stelle at or before the executing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell all his interest in the tract of land whereon he now resides, which is now conveyed to A M Hart trustee for Stratley & Williams: To have and to hold the said tract of land to him and his heirs forever. also the following personal property to wit 3 feather beds and furniture, 12 Chain and all other house hold furniture, his herd of Cattle, 2 cows & 9 herts and the increase of cattle and hogs, 1 Stead horse 15 or 20 bbls corn. Upon trust nevertheless, that the said Benj^r Cobb shall provided he lives be permitted to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said property hereby conveyed until the 25th day of December next. Then if default is made in the payment of the whole or in part, the said Samuel Stelle shall do soon as required either by the said Genry or Cobb's direction and sell the property herein conveyed after giving at least ten days previous notice of the time and place of such sale, and after paying the debts interest & cost of this conveyance pay the surplus to the said Benj^r Cobb or his order, or to any other person who may be legally authorized to receive the same. Prtlow doth hereby acknowledge, hath granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents, doth grant bargain and convey unto the said William Cobb his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing 100. acres, be the same more or less, lying and being in the County of Southampton and known by the name of the Pope tract and bounded on the North by Robert Ricks land on the East by William Cobb on the South and West by the Service tract and William Furness To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances therunto belonging, to him the said William Cobb his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said William Cobb his heirs and assigns forever and the said Robert S. Prtlow for himself, his heirs, executors and administrators, doth hereby covenant & agree
