Together with all the crop of corn, fodder, cotton, oats, wheat, and Branched which I may make this present year, also my Indentured interest in a negro boy named John Newsome. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators, to warrant and defend the title to the foregoing property herein conveyed, unto the said F. T. Ridley his heirs and assigns, against the claims and demands of all persons whatsoever. It is furthermore agreed upon between the parties to these presents, that should any one or more of the debts herein before mentioned remain unpaid after the first day of February eighteen hundred and forty four, that then and in that case, the said F. T. Ridley may after giving thirty days notice, sell to the highest bidder on a credit of nine months, all the aforesaid property or so much thereof as may be sufficient to pay all the within enumerated debts, together with all legal interest, expenses and cost arising from this instrument. In trust nevertheless that if the said John T. Judkins his heirs executors or administrators do and shall pay to the said Wm. Judkins, the sum of three hundred and one dollars and ninety three cents, and pay and discharge him the said William Judkins from the payment of all and every of the debts herein before named and especially that, then and in that case, this writing shall be void and of no effect.

Judkins and his wife Martha J. of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia of the first part, Francis T. Ridley of the same County of the second part and William Judkins & Robert Ridley of the said County of the third part. Witnesseth that the said Judkins & wife, in order to secure and provide for the payment of a bond executed by the said Judkins with William Judkins and Robert Ridley as his securities to P. R. Flynn Esq<sup>r</sup> to the heirs of Carroll W. Judkins deceased for the sum of six hundred and fifty five dollars & thirty one cents, lawful money of Virginia bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> day of August in the year above written, and its condition will necessarily appear, and also for and in consideration of five dollars of like money to the said Judkins in hand paid by the said F. T. Ridley before the signing sealing and delivery of this indenture, and have counted, bargained, sold, aliened and conveyed, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell alien and every part the said F. T. Ridley his heirs and assigns forever, One certain tract or parcel of land lying in the said County containing one hundred and fifty acres, together with all the buildings
