This INDENTURE made and entered into this 16th day of February 1843, between Joseph Ferguson, George Story and Lewis Vick, all of them of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Joseph Ferguson in order to secure to the said Lewis Vick the payment of one hundred sixty eight dollars and fifty cents justly due to the said Vick appearing by bond as well as this Indenture, each of which of even date also the interest which shall accrue thence as well as all reasonable costs of carrying on to effect these presents and the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said George Story at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Joseph Ferguson hath bargained and sold and doth hereby grant, bargain and sell unto the said George Story the following named property to wit two feather beds and furniture one clock one man Saddle, one gun, two tables, one tub, one chest one pot, one pan, one spider one case ten iron forks six plates, six cups & saucers, one dish, one pot rack pair and irons, one hand saw, one draw knife, three axes, three plane hoes, three coulters, one scythe parcel of cast iron hardware, one cart, 4 wheels, three bread boards & seven shoals, rings, shovel & broad iron, about twelve lbs corn about three thousand lbs. fodder, about seven hundred lbs Bacon, about fifty lbs lard in stand that contains said lard one big crock, three mud & one grub hogs, about two bushels pease & beans and to hold the above described property and every part and parcel thereof to him the said George Story his heirs and assigns with all the right title interest and estate which he the said Ferguson has hitherto held & enjoyed, to him the said George Story his heirs and assigns forever. In Trust nevertheless, that is to say if either the said Ferguson or Vick or their legal representatives shall at any time hereafter require said Story to sell as much or all of the above named property as may be required to pay the before named debt interest & costs as aforesaid it shall be the bounden duty of him the said George Story forthwith to advertise the time and place of such intended sale at least ten days previous thereto, and out of the proceeds thereof pay and discharge the said debt interest, and costs as aforesaid & if surplus money remain thereafter pay the same to him the said Joseph Ferguson or in case the said debt &c shall be paid otherwise than by sale as herein provided, that then and in that case the said George Story shall release the property or the title therof hereby transferred to him by the said Ferguson.
