Bishop for and in consideration of the sum of twenty seven dollar and forty six cents current money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said John C. Beal at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Have granted bargain and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth grant bargain and sell unto him the said John C. Beal his heirs and assigns forever one certain piece or parcel of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Luke, containing by estimation five acres to the same more or less it being a part of the tract of land of which James Bishop did propose and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at a dead gum standing near a small branch, a new corner made in said John C. Beal's line thence along his line a South Easterly course to define a corner thence a westerly course as aforesaid dead gum standing in the aforesaid branch, a new corner made in said John C.
