This Indenture made and entered into this 20th day of February in the year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three between Lemuel B. Robertson of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part Nelson B. Gardner of the County of
Isle of Wight and State of Virginia of the second part & John M. Williams of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia of the third part. Whereas the said Lemuel B. Robertson
is justly indebted to the said John M. Williams in first sum of one hundred & nine
dollars and forty two cents, bearing date with these presents also to be due two debts of
twenty five dollars for which the said John M. Williams is bound as security and the said
Lemuel B. Robertson being willing and desirous to secure the same. It is this Indenture
witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further sum of one dollar
in hand paid by the said Nelson B. Gardner to the said Lemuel B. Robertson at and before the
sealing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that the
said Lemuel B. Robertson hath given granted conveyed and confirmed and do by these presents
give grant bargain and sell unto the said Nelson B. Gardner his heirs &c. one certain tract
or parcel of land lying and being situate in the County of Isle of Wight containing one
hundred & nine acres and be the same more or less also the tract of land wherein the said
Lemuel B. Robertson now resides in the County of Southampton containing eighty acres more
or less. Together with the following Chattel Estate. To wit one several more or less
key fully one still and empty casks, three feather beds and furniture on clock one
bed. one cart and wheels one chest 2 Tables six head of cattle one gun one apple tree and
two cider pressed barrel of beer. corn fodder Peas &c. Ten head of hogs Farming utensils
and cooking tools eight sitting chairs two trunks one spinning wheel also the crop of
all kinds that may be made the present year in said farms, with all and singular the
appurtenances therunto belonging to the said Lemuel B. Robertson his heirs &c. unto the said Nelson
B. Gardner his heirs &c. and the said Lemuel B. Robertson doth for himself his heirs &c.
covenant and agree to and with the said Nelson B. Gardner his heirs &c. in manner and form
following that the said Nelson B. Gardner his heirs &c. shall permit the said Lemuel B. Robertson
to remain in quiet possession of the said lands & chattel estate until default be made or
the payment of the aforesaid debt either in part or the whole, then upon further trust
that so soon as default be made of payment of such debts the said Nelson B. Gardner
shall at the request of him the John M. Williams his heirs or assigns expose the said lands
and chattel estate (or so much thereof as shall be necessary to pay off the aforesaid debt
and interest and costs) to public sale hereafter giving legal notice say ten days and out of
the proceeds of said sale pay the aforesaid debt interest & costs and the surplus money (if any)
pay to him the said Lemuel B. Robertson his heirs or assigns. But if the whole of
the whole of the aforesaid debt and costs be paid off to the satisfaction of him the said
John M. Williams or before the first day of January 1844 then this indenture
to be made void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue Given under our
