This Indenture, made and executed on this the fifteenth day of March in the year eighteen hundred and forty three, by and between Elizabeth P Bevan, Thomas Bevan who is the husband of said Elizabeth P Bevan, Henry Booth and Patrick H Rolling, parts of the first part and Thomas Bullion party of the second part, all of whom, the said parties and persons, reside in the County of Southampton and Commonwealth of Virginia Westville. That whereas, by a certain Indenture bearing date on the fourteenth day of March in this year eighteen hundred and forty three, recorded in the County Court Clerks Office of said County, wherein the said parties of the first part are named as parties therunto, and to which reference is herein and hereby had and made, the said Thomas Bevan for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Bullion, and also for and in consideration of the further sum of five dollars likewise to him in hand paid by the said Booth & Rolling, did grant bargain sell and convey aforesaid transfer and set over unto the said Booth & Rolling their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever, all and every the right, title and interest which he, the said Thomas Bevan, had theretofore derived and might then have, and might thereafter at any time have and possess, in any manner, at law and in equity by means and in right of his wife the said Elizabeth P Bevan, or in and to the pecuniary or money part or portion of the estate whereof one Peter Booth (late of said County) did dispose, together with all interest that might theretofore have accrued, and might then be due, and might or should thereafter accrue on the said money part or portion as aforesaid, and which said money part or portion is directed by the will of the said Peter Booth, recorded in the County Court Clerks Office of said County to be distributed among those lawfully entitled thereto on the first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and forty five. In trust for the sole and benefit and as the separate estate of the said Elizabeth P Bevan. Now therefore the said Elizabeth P Bevan, by virtue of the tenor and effect of the said Indenture above recited, and with the knowledge and consent of the said Booth and Rolling (which said knowledge and consent are signified and attested by their the said Booth & Rolling, being parties to and signifying and delivering these presents) and also for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and eight dollars to her, the said Elizabeth P Bevan in hand paid by the said Thomas Bullion at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents doth grant, bargain sell, convey alien, assign, transfer and set over unto the said Thomas Bullion, his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever, all and every the aforesaid right, title and interest as hereinbefore described and set
