Bevan: Now Therefore the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the premises and also of the sum of five dollars to him in hand paid by the said Thomas J. Pellow, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and convey unto the said Thomas J. Pellow, his heirs and assigns in full simple form a certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County and Commonwealth aforesaid, containing one hundred and seventeen and one half acres, and bounded on the north by the lands of Nicholas J. Barnum, on the East by the lands of Patrick H. Rollings aforesaid, on the South by the lands of John H. Booth and of Edwin Travis, and on the West by the lands of Henry Booth; the said certain tract or parcel of Land being that which was allotted to the said Elizabeth P. Bevan as her inheritance from the estate of her father one John Booth deceased and on which said certain tract or parcel of land the said parties of the first part at this time reside: To have and to hold the aforesaid certain tract or parcel of land, together with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, unto him the said Thomas J.
