This Indenture made this fourteenth day of March eighteen hundred and forty three between Jesse Carrell of the first part Alfred J. Brattle of the second part and Benjamin G. Washington of the third part. Witnesseth whereas the said Jesse Carrell is justly indebted to the said Benjamin G. Washington in the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid on the eighteenth day of the above mentioned month (March) as by a bond due the eighteenth day of March 1843 more fully and plainly appeared which debt with with the legal interest thereon accruing the said Jesse Carrell is willing and desirous to secure. Now this indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said Jesse Carrell in hand paid by the said Alfred J. Brattle at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said Jesse Carrell hath bargained sold and confirmed, and by these presents doth bargain sell and confirm to the said Alfred J. Brattle his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing one hundred fifty five acres and bounded by the lands of A. J. Barham, H. Gay, James Brattle and others also the following property vizt. one negro by one Correll more than fourteen beds of furniture two tables two chests, 1 trunk, 8 sitting chairs, 1 bridle & saddle, 1 pair of harness, one cart & wheels, the crop of corn & fodder now on hand, twelve hogs, one ass, all my farming utensils, one loom, all of my kitchen furniture, also my interest in a negro man Will who is now the driver estate of my Mother. To have and to hold the above said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances also all the other property herein before mentioned unto the said Alfred J. Brattle his heirs and assigns forever. Upon trust nevertheless that the said Alfred J. Brattle shall as soon as ordered by the said Benjamin G. Washington as he him self may think proper proceed to sell the said tract or parcel of land and other property after giving ten days public notice at two or more Store houses in the precinct to the highest bidder for Cash Current Money of Virginia & out of the money arising from the the sale first pay and satisfy all reasonable Charges attending sales and these presents and then the debt above
