This Indenture, made this 20<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year 1843 between  
 Elijah Nelms & Matilda his wife of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of  
 the first part James M Parker of the aforesaid County State of the second part, and  
 Henry B Vaughan of the same County State of the third part, Witnesseth, that the said  
 Elijah Nelms in order to secure provision for the payment of a bond given by the said  
 Nelms to the said Henry B Vaughan for the payment of Seven hundred and eighty  
 eight dollars of lawful money of the United States, bearing date on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of February  
 1843 & now due & payable as by the said bond will more fully appear and also for the con-  
 sideration of five dollars of like money, to the said Nelms wife in hand paid by the  
 said Parker before the signing sealing & delivery of this indenture have granted, conveyed,  
 sold, aliened & conveyed & by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien and convey unto the  
 said James M Parker one tract or parcel of land situated lying & being in the County  
 of State aforesaid, containing Four hundred & ninety & one fourth acres, & bounded, on the  
 east by the road leading from Jerusalem to broad water bridge, on the north by the lands  
 of Bennell Williams, & the lands belonging to the heirs of James Dell, on the West by the  
 land of Roberts H Simmons & Co<sup>ts</sup> & the land of John Scarborough, on the south by the  
 road leading from the broad water road to Petersburg. To have & to hold the said  
 tract or parcel of land & all the buildings & improvements thereon & the appurtenances of  
 every kind thereto belonging & all the estate, right, <sup>title</sup> & interest of the said Nelms & Matilda  
 his wife therein, unto the said James M Parker his heirs & assigns forever but in trust, (Notwith-  
 standing) and for the purposes following, to wit: First if the money now due by virtue of the before men-  
 tioned bond or any part of it shall remain due and unpaid by the said Nelms his heirs  
 executors or administrators, to the said Henry B Vaughan his executors, administrators or  
 assigns, on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of February 1844, then & in that case the said James M Parker  
 shall thereafter, when required by the said Henry B Vaughan his executors, administrators or  
 assigns, or by his or their agent or agents in that behalf, sell & dispose of in fee simple, at public  
 auction, to the highest bidder, for ready money, the said tract of land with all the buildings &  
 improvements thereon, & the appurtenances of every kind thereto belonging, for the purpose of paying  
 the money so remaining due and unpaid as aforesaid, including interest on the principle at the  
 time of such sale, & also, for the purpose of defraying the costs & charges of such sale & thereupon  
 shall employ the sum by a deed or deeds sufficient in law to pass & assure to the purchaser or  
 purchasers a good title thereto, agreeably to the sale so made & the power herein given, and  
 after making such sale & receiving the proceeds thereof, shall without delay proceed, first &  
 discharging the costs & charges of such sale & all the expenses attending the execution of the  
 trust hereby created; secondly to pay the money due by virtue of the said bond & other  
 remaining unpaid, including interest on the principle to the day of making the said  
 sale; and lastly, to account for and pay over to the said Elijah Nelms his executors  
 administrators or assigns, whatever sum of money of the proceeds may remain after the two  
 first objects have been effected; but if the time, place & terms of such sale the said James  
 M Parker, after fixing the time & place thereof, at his discretion, shall give at least ten days  
 days notice by causing an advertisement thereof to be posted at the door of the County  
 House & at least two other public places in the before mentioned County. I do hereby  
 this indenture is upon this further confidence, that the said James M Parker shall  
 permit the said Elijah Nelms & his heirs, & all persons claiming under him or them
