

Josiah Wooddy also two feather beds and furniture, one china press and contents
 one walnut table, one dining table, ten sitting chairs, one case of drawers, and
 all the balance of my household and kitchen furniture and all of my farm
 mowing utensils and one sow and eight shucks and all of my stock made this
 tract or parcel of land and premises together with the aforesaid personal property
 unto him the said John R Rochelle his heirs Executors and administrators for
 the following trust and purposes that is to say of the said Edmund Underwood
 shall find to pay unto the said Edward Beaton the debt of aforesaid due him
 with interest which may accrue thereon any part of the said debt & interest
 when demanded. It shall and may be lawful for the said John R Rochelle
 or in case of his death for his legal personal representative who is hereby au-
 thorized to act upon being thereto required by the said Edward Beaton or
 his Executor administering or assigns to make sale of the property aforesaid for
 cash having given at least ten days previous public notice of the time and
 place and out of the monies arising therefrom first pay and satisfy the debt
 and interest aforesaid, or so much as may be due at the time, and the cost and
 expenses attending said sale and this conveyance and the balance of any pay
 over to the said Edmund Underwood his order or legal personal representative
 but if the said Edmund Underwood shall well and truly pay and discharge the debt
 aforesaid and interest due thereon when demanded, this indenture is to be null and

This Indenture made this 4th day of March 1843 between John Vick & wife
 Polly of the County of Southampton and Parish of Newbury of the one part and
 Augustus M Vick of said County of the other part Witness that the said John
 Vick & wife for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars current
 money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Augustus M Vick the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged and therefore doth acquit and discharge the said Augus-
 tus M Vick his heirs and assigns by these presents. Then choate John Vick & wife
 Polly hath granted bargained and sold & by these presents doth grant bargain
 and sell unto the said Augustus M Vick and his heirs or assigns forever one certain
 tract of land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by a late survey
 two hundred and sixty acres and is the land which was allotted to Miss
 Sally Briggs lying on the Cadwinton swamp which land I purchased of the
