

Josiah Morel also two feather beds and furniture, one china prop and contents, one walnut table, one dining table, ten setting chairs, one case of drawers, and all the balance of my house hold and kitchen furniture and all of my farming utensils and one cow and eight sheep and all of my ch of set made this year corn fodder peastatoes and branly to have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises together with the aforesaid personal property unto him the said John R. Rochelle his heirs Executors and administrators for the following trust and purposes that is to say of the said Edmund Underwood shall fail to pay unto the said Edward Beaton the debt of resaid due him with interest which may accrue thereon any part of the said debt & interest when demanded, it shall and may be lawful for the said John R. Rochelle in case of his death for his legal personal representative who is hereby authorized to act upon being thereto required by the said Edmund R. Beaton his Executor administrator or assigns to make sale of the property of aforesaid for cash having given at least ten days previous public notice of the time and place and out of the monies arising therefrom first pay and satisfy the debt and interest aforesaid, or so much as may be due at the time, and the cost and expenses attending said sale and this conveyance and the balance of any pay over to the said Edmund Underwood at his order or legal personal representation but if the said Edmund Underwood shall well and truly pay and discharge the debt aforesaid and interest due thereon when demanded, this indenture is to be null and void and of no effect. This Indenture made this 1st day of March 1843 between John Vick & wife Polly of the County of Southampton and parish of Totaway of the one part and Augustus M Vick of said County of the other part witness that the said John Vick & wife for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Augustus M Vick the receipt whereof is fully acknowledged and therefore doth accept and discharge the said Augustus M Vick his heirs and assigns by these presents. Then thos said John Vick & wife Polly both granted bargained and sold & by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Augustus M Vick and his heirs or assigns forever one certain tract of land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by a late survey two hundred and sixty acres and is the land which was allotted to Miss Sally Briggs lying on the Badenoke swamp which land I purchased of the
