

Godder, one sorrell mare one cow and calf, two head hogs, one cart and harness all household and kitchen furniture, all the crop made by the said George Foy this year (say 1843) say crop corn, Godder, Shucks, peas, Cotton potatoes and oats, also all his farming utensils. To have and to hold to him the said William D. Clarke's only heirs, use and behoof forever upon trust it overthelf that the said William D. Clarke should at the request of either one of the parties aforesaid, after giving at least ten days notice of the time and place of the sale, sell at public auction all the property hereby conveyed, or so much thereof as will be sufficient to satisfy all of said debt. Interest and cost and out of the proceeds pay the expenses thereof then the aforesaid debt. In full due the said Harrison P. Pope and the balance of any money due to the said George Foy or his legal representative, and the said George Foy covenant with the said William D. Clarke, that he the said George Foy is possessed of an absolute fee simple right in the property hereby conveyed, and that he will forever warrant and defend the same against himself and all other persons whatsoever. This Indenture made and entered into the 17th day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty three. Between John W. Reese of the first part, William L. Booth of the second part and Benj. E. Pope Southport D. Baskam, Henry Kindred Nathaniel James and Henry Moore and Irisella D. Barnes, all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the third part. Whereas the said John W. Reese is justly indebted to the said Ben E. Pope in the sum of one hundred and eight dollars and 3/4^{ths} due by bond bearing date the 28th day of February 1842 and the said John W. Reese being justly indebted to Southport D. Baskam in the sum of eighty four dollars and 1/2^{cts} due by bond bearing date the 28th of February 1843. and the said John W. Reese being justly indebted to Henry Kindred by bond in the sum of sixty two dollars and 1/2^{cts} bearing date the 17th of January 1842, also another bond executed to William L. Booth and endorsed to the said Henry Kindred for twelve dollars due the 21st of December 1842 and the said John W. Reese being, or will be justly indebted to the said Nathaniel James the 25th day of December 1842, in the sum of twenty five dollars the same being for the services of the said James as overseer and manager for the said Reese the present year, and whereas the said Henry Moore is the said John W. Reese's security to a bond executed to John W. Booth as executor of John W. Reese's debt, and the said bond being now in the possession of Doct. Alfred Eldridge the balance due on said bond, being thirty dollars or thereabouts as will more
