Pope Ruthbert D. Barkham. Henry Hinckley Nathaniel James and Henry Moore and Priscilla D. Barnes. all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the third part. Whereas the said John W. Reese is justly indebted to the said Ben C. Pope in the sum of one hundred and eight dollars and 37⁰⁰ due by bond bearing date the 28th day of February 1843 and the said John W. Reese being justly indebted to Ruthbert D. Barkham in the sum of eighty four dollars and 48⁰⁰ by bond bearing date the 28th of February 1843. and the said John W. Reese being justly indebted to Henry Hinckley by bond in the sum of Sixty two dollars and 47⁰⁰ bearing date the 17th of January 1842. also another bond executed to William D. James and endorsed to the said Henry Hinckley. for twelve dollars due the 21st of December 1842. and the said John W. Reese being, or will be justly indebted to the said Nathaniel James the 25th day of December 1843. in the sum of twenty five dollars the same being for the services of the said James as overseer and manager for the said Reese. the present year. and whereas the said Henry Moore is the said John W. Reese's security to a bond executed to John M. Gentry as successor of John D. Barnes d. d. and the said bond being now in the possession of Doct Alfred Eldridge the balance due on said bond. being thirty dollars or thereabout as will more
