Witnesseth that the said Thomas Dunford and Martha his wife have for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, bargained and sold, and by these presents bargained and sold unto the said Henry Dunford, his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton Va. Containing by estimation three hundred & thirty eight acres to the sum more or less, and is bounded as follows  $\frac{1}{3}$  Beginning at a small cypress in the run of the cedar swamp, on the side of the path, at the rising place, near the late residence of Jacob Darden deceased, thence eastwardly to a pine a corner in the edge of the piney old field, thence southwardly to a pine standing on the east side of a small pond, then a straight line eastwardly to a small Hickory on the bank of black water River, thence down the River to the mouth of the cedar swamp, thence up the said swamp the various courses thereof to the first station. It being the tract and parcel of land Jacob Darden deceased and Martha Darden deceased gave to their son Jethro Darden in the year 1817, and the same tract and parcel of land, the said Henry Dunford bought of Thomas Dunford and wife - To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land, with the revision and reversions, remainders and remainders, yearly and other rents found The said Thomas Dunford and Martha his wife doth hereby warrant and will forever defend the aforesaid premises unto Henry Dunford his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims, demand or demands of all and every person whatever. In Testimony whereof the said Thomas Dunford and Martha his wife, have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals, the day & year first written.
