Smith for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Edwin Harrison, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold and by then presents doth grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Edwin Harrison his heirs Executors administrators or assigns the following property to wit: One certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton State of Virginia containing by estimation two hundred & ninety three acres more or less bounded as follows to wit by the lands of John D. Hunt, Leonard Cobb the lands of the estate of Wm Harrison & James L. Harrison also the following slaves and other personal property to wit: Norman Hannah & child, Izacell, Erasmus, Lewis Jr. Sarah Lucy Lewis Sr. 2 horses, one buggy, double single harness, waggon, gun 1 cart & hubs & gear forming themselves household & kitchen furniture of every description together with the increase of the females of the aforesaid slaves. To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises with the buildings and improvements thereon & appurtenances of every description together with the aforesaid slaves and other personal property above named unto him the said Edwin Harrison his heirs & or assigns forever. Upon the following trust & confidence. Notwithstanding that the said Benjamin M. Smith shall be permitted to retain possession of the aforesaid property and to take the profits thereof to his own use until the said Smith and Riddick or either of them shall have been compelled to pay the debt aforesaid for which they are securities at which time or any time after they the said Smith & Riddick shall have been compelled to pay the aforesaid debt, thereof it shall and may be lawful for the said Edwin Harrison upon being thereto requested by the said Smith & Riddick or either of them, to make sale of the property aforesaid or so much thereof as may be sufficient and out of the proceeds of sale after paying all expenses, reimburse the said Smith & Riddick the amount they may have been compelled to pay as security aforesaid with interest thereon and the balance restore to the said Benjamin M. Smith - In Witness whereof the parties of the first second part have hereunto set their hands & affixed their seals the day and year first aforesaid.
