This Indenture, made and entered into this 2nd day of May, one thousand
 Eight hundred and forty three, between Levi Waller of the first, William D. Clarke
 of the second part, Nathaniel Francis and B. B. & P. Pope, of the third part, all of the
 County of Southampton and State of Virginia. This Indenture witnesseth that whereas
 the said Nathaniel Francis is bound as security for the said Levi Waller in a bond
 due John Day for one hundred and twenty eight dollars and 25¢ of even date
 with this Indenture, and on demand the 25th day of December next and furthermore the
 said Levi Waller is justly indebted to the said Nathaniel Francis in the sum of two
 hundred and twenty dollars due by bond and of date with this Indenture, also the said
 Levi Waller is indebted to the above named B. B. & P. Pope in the sum of one hundred
 dollars due by bond and of even date with this Indenture, and the said Levi Waller
 being willing and desirous to secure the above mentioned debts, interest and cost. Now
 this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the
 further consideration of one dollar to him the said Levi Waller in hand paid by the
 said William D. Clarke at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged; he the said Levi Waller hath given, granted, bargained
 sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain, sell and confirm to the said William D.
 Clarke his heirs and assigns forever, the following property to wit, One negro man David
 Bede and furniture three tables, one desk one side board twelve sitting chairs six
 one large kettle, three ovens, two frying pans, with all other house hold and kitchen furniture
 farming utensils of every kind, one still, cop, worm and tub, one cotton gin, one side mill
 press, fifty cedar posts one tan vat, blacksmiths and shop joiners tools one wagon, two
 horse carts wheels and gear, six ploughs & traces, one lock chain, three head of horses two head
 of cattle, thirteen head of sheep fifty head of pigs, also his the said Levi Waller's interest
 crops of every kind made by him this year 1843. say crops of corn, fodder, cotton, peas, for
 tobacco, apple brandy, wheat & buckwheat, he have and he hold to his the said William D. Clarke
 proper use and behoof forever Upon Trust, Nevertheless, that the said William D. Clarke
 shall at the request of any one of the aforesaid parties, after giving reasonable notice
 of time and place of sale, sell at public auction for Cash all the property hereby
 conveyed, or so much thereof as will satisfy the above named debts, interest and cost, and
 out of the proceeds first pay the expenses thereof, then pay the several debts aforesaid, say
 the debt due John Day which the said Nathaniel Francis is bound as security for, the
 debt due Nathaniel Francis and the debt due B. B. & P. Pope and the balance if any
 pay over to the said Levi Waller or his legal representative, and the said Levi Waller
 doth covenant with the said William D. Clarke that he is possessed of an absolute
