ing the carrying these premises into effect, secondly pay and satisfy the debt above
described together with the legal interest which may accrue, and the surplus if any
pay to the said James C. Taylor his heirs executors or administrators or to any person

This Indenture made and entered into on this 16th day of January
in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and forty three between John R. Rochelle of the
County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and William G. Wilson
of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John R.
Rochelle for and in consideration of the sum of ninety three dollars seventy seven and
half cents paid to William L. Rochelle by the said William G. Wilson on the 25th day
of January 1841, as will appear by reference to the deed of bargain and sale from said
William L. Rochelle to said William G. Wilson of that date, for the same tract or
parcel of land hereby conveyed the receipt of the aforesaid sum of ninety three dollars
and seventy seven & half cents is hereby acknowledged in consideration whereof he the said
John R. Rochelle hath granted bargained sold aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed &
by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto him the said
William G. Wilson his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of land
situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint
Sukes containing by a recent survey thirty and one fourth acres be the same more
or less, it being a part of the tract of land the said William L and John R. Rochelle
inherited from Edmund Day, and bounded by the lands of Vista Pop. Harry
Singer, said William G. Wilson and others, for further particulars respecting the
boundaries reference may be had to the above mentioned Deed from William L
Rochelle to said William G. Wilson. To have and to hold the above described
tract or parcel of land and premises with all and singular its appurtenances
