Taylor his heirs executors or administrators or to any person whom he may appoint to receive the same by his writing. This Indenture made and entered into on this 16<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and forty three between John R. Rockelle of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and William G. Wilson of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John R. Rockelle for and in consideration of the sum of ninety three dollars seventy seven and half cents paid to William L. Rockelle by the said William G. Wilson on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of January 1841, as will appear by reference to the deed of bargain and sale from said William L. Rockelle to said William G. Wilson of that date for the same tract or parcel of land hereby conveyed the receipt of the aforesaid sum of ninety three dollars and seventy seven and half cents is hereby acknowledged in consideration whereof he the said John R. Rockelle hath granted bargained sold aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed by these presents both grant, bargain, sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto him the said William G. Wilson his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Luke's containing by a recent survey thirty and one fourth acre be the same more or less, it being a part of the tract of land the said William L. and John R. Rockelle inherited from Edmund Day, and bounded by the lands of Westa Pope, Henry Soyner, said William G. Wilson and others, for further particulars respecting the boundaries reference may be had to the above mentioned Deed from William L. Rockelle to said William G. Wilson.
