I Solomon Fletcher have this day bargained and sold and do hereby transfer and convey to Thomas Pittman and his heirs for the consideration of forty dollars and fifty cents to me paid, a tract of land in the County of Southampton, and State of Virginia containing by estimation sixty four & one eighth acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of John Wigham, Solomon Fletcher John Williamson John W. Holman and Mary Stephenson. I Solomon Fletcher do further bind myself my heirs executors or assigns to allow the said Thomas Pittman his heirs or assigns forever a free pathway for a cart through the north side of the land above I now reside to the public road, called the Suffolk road. To have and to hold the same to the said Thomas Pittman his heirs and assigns forever. I the said Solomon Fletcher do covenant to the said Thomas Pittman that I and lawfully seized of said lands have a good right to convey it and that the same is unincumbered. I do further covenant and bind myself my heirs and representatives to warrant and forever defend the title to the said land and every part thereof to the said Thomas Pittman his heirs and assigns against the lawful claim of all persons whatsoever. This Indenture made this 11th day of May in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty three, between Robert Murrell of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia on the first part and James H. Sykes of the S. C. County and State on the second part and Jas. H. Bland of the aforesaid County and State of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the aforesaid Robert Murrell stands justly indebted to the said Joseph H. Bland by an written obligation bearing date above written, for the sum of one hundred dollars and lawful money of Virginia and for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him the S. Robert Murrell in hand paid by the said James H. Sykes before the signing and sealing of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the aforesaid Robert Murrell hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the S. James H. Sykes his heirs & assigns forever the following property to wit: his entire crop of corn, cotton, potatoes, tobacco, spruce, ash, white gum, grand stone & fifty sides tanning bark, more or less and four bee hives. To have and to hold the said property herein specified unto him the S. James H. Sykes his heirs or assigns forever upon trust nevertheless and upon the express condition that if the said Robert Murrell should fail to pay off and settle the aforesaid
