This Indenture made this 28 day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two between James Johnson and wife Edith of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and John B. Jenkins of the same County and State of the second part, witnesseth that the said James Johnson and wife Edith for and in consideration of the sum of Forty four dollars and sixty two cents in hand paid by the said John B. Jenkins at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James Johnson and wife Edith both granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said John B. Jenkins his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County and State aforesaid known as the lands whereon the said James Johnson and wife Edith and bounded as follows (to wit) Commencing on the west side near the main publick road leading from Franklin by Saynor's mounting house at a white oak thence running through said Johnsons field nearly a straight course to another oak standing in the line of the lands belonging to the heirs of Unah V. Gardner thence nearly a north course a long a line of marked trees in said Gardner line to a pine a corner tree thence by a line of marked trees a straight course to pine a corner of John B. Jenkins and James Johnson and thence running nearly a South course to the white oak at the beginning along a line of marked trees containing twelve and 3/4 acres more or less together with all and singular
