This Indenture made this 10th day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty three between James Vick trustee of the first part James Drury debtor of the second part and John Vick creditor of the third part. Whereas the said James Drury on the 14th day of May in the year 1835^o in order to secure the payment of the sum of three hundred and seventy five dollars to the said John Vick did by indenture of trust of that date convey to the said James Vick his heirs executors &c the following property to wit, one certain tract of land lying in Round hill swamp adjoining the land of Wiley Wellons do^o John Claytons land and Rich^d Stephensons land containing by estimation two hundred and twenty six acres be the same more or less. Upon trust for the uses and purposes in the said indenture mentioned: and whereas since the executing and delivering of the said deed of trust the said James Drury has fully satisfied and paid to the said John Vick the sum of money thereby secured which the said John Vick does hereby acknowledge. Now the indenture sheweth that for the consideration aforesaid, as well as for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said James Drury to the said James Vick at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James Vick trustee with the assent and approbation of the said John Vick signified by his being a party to these presents, and the said John Vick have granted bargained and sold remised, released and confirmed, and by these presents do grant bargain and sell remise release and confirm unto the said James Drury all the estate right title interest claim and demand both at law and in equity which the said James Vick and John Vick have or hold in the land &c above described. To have and to hold the said trust or parcel of land &c to the said James Drury his heirs and assigns forever. To the only proper use and behoof of him the said James Drury his heirs and assigns forever and the said James Vick and John Vick for themselves their heirs executors and administrators to and to the said James Drury his heirs and assigns in as full and ample manner as the same was warranted by the said James Drury by the deed of trust above recited. do warrant the same to the said James Drury against the claim or claims of them the said James Vick and John Vick and all persons claiming by or under them or either of them. In witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written.
