Phillips, healthfully satisfied and paid to the said James D. Bryant the sum of money thereby secured, which the said Jas. D. Bryant doth hereby acknowledge. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for the consideration of and as of one dollar in hand paid by the said William D. Phillips to the said Jas. D. Bryant at and before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John M. Gurley with the assent and approbation of the said James D. Bryant, signified by his being party to these presents, and the said James D. Bryant have granted bargain and sold, released released and conveyed unto the said William D. Phillips, all the estate claim and demand both at law and equity which the said John M. Gurley and James D. Bryant have or hold in said land premises and other property as above described to the only proper use and behoof of him the said William D. Phillips his heirs executors &c. forever and the said John M. Gurley and James D. Bryant for themselves their heirs executors and administrators the above mentioned land and Slaves unto the said William D. Phillips his heirs executors and assigns in as full and ample manner as the same was warranted by the said William D. Phillips by the dead of Trust above recited. Moore pursuant to a decree of the County Court of Southampton pronounced at its May Term 1843. in a suit depending therein between Harrison Joyner plaintiff and Eliza Jane, Nancy and Catharine Bryant by Harrison D. Moore their guardian ad litem defendants, did on this day on the premises (having advertised the time and place of sale for fifteen days at the Court house and two other public places in the neighbourhood) sell to the highest bidder upon a credit of six months (except for so much as was necessary to pay the costs & expenses of the said sale & disburse which was for Cash) the tract of land of which Lewis Joyner died seized and possessed containing about thirty two acres situated in the County of Southampton, and at the sale so made the said Harrison Joyner became the purchaser of the said tract of land by bidding therefor the sum of sixty two dollars, which was the highest bid made for the same, and so therefore the said Harrison D.
