This Indenture made the 1st day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty three between Elizabeth Williams of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part. and James Holmes of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Elizabeth Williams in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fourteen dollars and fifty cents to her in hand paid at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said James Holmes his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County aforesaid, containing by estimation one hundred and fourteen and a half acres be the same more or less, and bounded as follows viz: Beginning at an ash tree standing in the mouth of deep branch, near a corner tree between the said Elizabeth Williams and James Holmes (formerly Edmund Barnes) thence up the said branch to a red oak standing in the head of the said branch a corner tree in the said Elizabeth Williams line, thence West along a line of marked trees still lying in said Williams line to a black gum standing in the Hog pen branch a corner tree in the said Williams and Holmes line, thence down the said Hog pen branch to the run of the Cypress swamp, thence down the various courses of the run of the said Cypress swamp to the ash tree the first named Station, it being the tract of land devised by the late Russell Williams dec^d of this County, to his wife (now widow) the said Elizabeth Williams together with all and singular the appurtenances, remainders & remainderments yearly and other rents, issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof To have and To hold, the said one hundred and fourteen and a half acres of land with the Tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold, and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights, members and appurtenances unto the said James Holmes his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Elizabeth Williams for herself
