Heretofore made this 17th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three between James Dreuy and Sally his wife first part Alfred T Stephenson of the second part and Joseph Joiner of the third part whereas the said James Dreuy is justly indebted to the said Joseph Joiner sum of two hundred twenty dollars & 74 1/4 cents to be paid on the 23rd day of March next eighteen hundred & forty two as by a bond bearing date on the 21st day of March in the year more fully appears which debt the said James Dreuy and wife is willing and desirous to owe And whereas the said Joseph Joiner stands security for the said James Dreuy for the sum of one hundred & forty one dollars & 59 cents to be paid on the 17th day of May in the year eighteen hundred & forty three as by a bond bearing date on the 17th day of May in year 1843 more fully appears which debt the said James Dreuy and wife is willing and desirous to owe the said Joseph Joiner from any danger on account of such security Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said James Dreuy in hand paid by the said Alfred T Stephenson at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said James Dreuy and wife have given granted bargained sold alien enfeoff released confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release confirm to the said Alfred T Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever all the tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia containing two hundred and fifty acres by the same more or less and bounded as follows by the lands of A. B. Bengal, Marionette H. Branch, Edwin Gardner and Emma Branch with all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of land belonging or in any wise appertaining also all the chattel estate of the said Dreuy and wife one big Billy, four head of cattle, fifteen head of hogs and other future increase there beds of furniture all my house hold kitchen furniture, chairs tables pots pans &c &c wheels all my farming utensils &c Crop of corn fodder Brandy &c and all other thing that may be on the premises when default is made in and to the said granted or intended to be hereby granted trust or parcel of land and premises and the other above named property. And all the estate right title and interest of the said James Dreuy and wife to have and to hold the said hereby granted or intended to be granted to be hereby granted to or parcel of land chattels and premises with its appurtenances unto the said Alfred T Stephenson his heirs executors administrators or assigns forever to the only proper and behoof of the said Alfred T Stephenson his heirs executors administrators or assigns forever and the said James Dreuy & wife for themselves their heirs executors assigns or assigns doth hereby covenant promise and agree to and with the said Alfred T Stephenson his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever in manner and form following that is to say that the said James Dreuy and wife their heirs executors and administrators the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and chattel estate and premises with their appurtenances unto the said Alfred T Stephenson his heirs executors and assigns against all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and recover defend by these presents upon trust nevertheless that the said Alfred T Stephenson his heirs executors and administrators permit the said James Dreuy & wife to remain in quiet possession of the said tract or parcel of land chattels and premises in
