This Indenture made this 8th day of July 1803 between John Vick
of the first part and John B. Vick trustee of the second part and James Vick, tinner
of the third part all of the County the County of Southampton and State of Virginia
Witnesseth that said John Vick for an consideration of the sum of one dollar
to him in hand paid by the said John B. Vick, at or before the recording of this
presente the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged as well as the further consideration
of the sum of seven hundred & twenty four dollars it being so to count for the land
John Vick now or leasenly holding due to the Sheriff of Southampton County
for negroes late belonging to Samuel B. Hines, which the said James Vick was
the said John Vick security to the Sheriff for the said indomitting land to which
I do say John Vick is willing to leave the said James Vick both a copy
and John B. Vick our certain tract of land lying and being in County of
Southampton containing three hundred acres to the same more or less known
as follows to wit by the lands of Capt Edwards Battle by the lands of Richard
Pinnion Esq by the land of Augustine McVick and by the land of Jeremiah
Coll and I also leaving all my crop of corn for John Vick to take get along
out of wheat oats &c I may all the above named land and crop unto the
said John B. Vick, and also the said John B. Vick may claim in his behalf
money arising from the sale of the said land and crop providing that the said
land and crop may sell for more than will pay the amount that the said James
Vick is standing security for or otherwise bound in another deed of trust
and the over plus if any to pay unto the said John Vick upon this special
trust and condition that the said John B. Vick shall make sale of the above
mentioned land and crop every time after advertising ten days notice to the day
of sale at publick for the best price that can be obtained for the same any
time after the 8th day of July 1803 at the courthouse door and other many other
places as the said John B. Vick may see fit with the money arising from
the sale of the said land and crop shall first pay unto the said James Vick
all the bonds or bonds whitch he is standing security for and the over plus of
any to be paid unto the said John Vick and the said John Vick to have
and defend unto John B. Vick his heirs or assigns forever to the above named land
and crop and the said John B. Vick do agree to make sale of the above named land
and crop when required by the said James Vick, the tinner aforesaid
the said John Vick and John B. Vick and James Vick have countersigned their
hands and seals this day and date first above written
