

His Indenture

1843 between John A Darden of the first part, Seth D Williams of the second part and Jennings T Smith of the third part, whereas the said John A Darden is indebted to the said Smith in the sum of twenty four dollars & fifty cents due by bond bearing date with their parents, and whereas also the said Smith hath become bound as a security for the said John A Darden on sundry bonds to wit: One in favor of Elias Smith for about twenty five dollars date not recollcted one in favor of Miles Smith for about twenty dollars date not recollcted one in favor of Joshua Gilling for about forty dollars date not recollcted and one in favor of William Edwards adm of Anthony Vaughan for about twelve dollars date not recollcted and one annul in favor of Horpin Charles George Reed for about thirty five dollars date not recollcted and also five prom bonds in the hands of Alexander Smith constable in North Carolina all five amounting to about sixty or seventy dollars date not recollcted and also in all other cases in which the said Smith is now bound for one as security and whereas the said John A Darden is willing and desirous to paym of the said sum of money to the said Smith to secure such is willing to assign the said Smith hereunto & free from loss or damage by reason of the several indentures. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for the consideration of the promise & also for the further sum of one dollar in hand paid to the said Darden by the said Williams at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt is hereby acknowledged by the said John A Darden hath given granted bargained & sold by these presents doth give grant bargain sell & conform to the said Seth D Williams his heirs & assigns forever the following property to wit: four horses two cattle thirteen head of hogs seven head furniture consisting of one wood clock, one looking glass, four tables, two sets of furniture glass and crockery ware brass of the two silver chairs one bureau one chest, two wash stands, three trunks, kitchen furniture consisting of three pots, two hotbacks one iron one stove one tea kettle four pans, farming utensils consisting of two ploughs, two mowing hoes, and two grubbing hoes, also two guns two cast & rhabile, one double & two single spring two sets harness and one saddle, bridle, one set silver tea spoons four set silver table spoons and also one silver watch & a gold chain. He have and to hold all of the above said personal property hereby conveyed unto the said Seth D Williams his heirs & assigns administrated and assigns forever to the only use and behoof of the said Williams his heirs & assigns adm and assigns forever. Upon trust nevertheless the said John A Darden to remain in quiet possession of said personal property & take the profits thereof to his own use until he is released by the said Smith to sell whereupon the said Williams shall after advice being to him place of sale sell the said personal property for Cash & pay to the said Smith & interest due the said Smith and also pay the said several debts for which the said Smith is a security as aforesaid and out of the money arising from the said Smith after satisfying the aforesaid attending the said pay unto the said Smith such sum or sums as he may have paid or about to pay or have damaged as aforesaid and all interest & costs thereon and the sum and also if any shall be paid unto the said Darden his heirs & assigns adm or assigns But if the above mentioned bond or bonds amount to sum and be liable paid & faithfully discharged so that no default be made then this Indenture

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
