One hundred acres of Land it being the tract on which I the said James J. Williams now live bounded by the lands of James P. Reddick lately deceased lying in the 1st of the road leading west to Jerusalem and five miles or thereabouts distant, on horse saddle and bridle (a goodly) four beds, stands and furniture, twenty head of sheep, fifteen head of cattle, five head of stock, all my crop of corn &c &c now growing in the said County of Southampton & State of Virginia, two cloths, Rufflet, 3000 shen on dozen, Shirts together with all and singular my household and kitchen furniture cooking and farming utensils &c three carts, wheels and gear, one simple butley and harness and also all my stock of goods now on hand, with the privilege of selling and buying so that I keep the stock agreed as it now is, all my Merchandise and apparel, together with all and singular my other property in the said County of Southampton and State of Virginia not specially named in this instrument. To have and to hold unto him the said William P. Moore and his heirs forever After First — Overthrift that the said James J. Williams is to remain in quiet possession of all the aforesaid property &c until required by the said Abram Reddick to be sold whereupon the said William P. Moore shall after order bearing for ten days, proceed to sell for Cash or otherwise as agreed on all the property of the said James J. Williams and first pay the expense of sale &c then pay to the said Abram Reddick the sum of six hundred and ten dollars These with lawful interest from July 1843 and the balance in the hands of the said Moore & heirs he shall pay over to the said James J.
