My Indenture made and entered into this 1st day of August
one thousand eight hundred and forty three between Thomas Brentley of the
first part, James J. Williams of the second part and John Gwaltney of the third
part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereas the said
Tho. Brentley is fully indebted to the said John Gwaltney in the just and full sum
of twenty two dollars and fifty cents due by note bearing date July 15th 1843 &
the said Tho. Brentley being willing and desirous to secure the payment of the
aforesaid debt. Now this indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the
promises also for the sum of one dollar to the said Thomas Brentley to him or his
paid by the said Jas. J. Williams stand before the sealing and delivering the present
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that the said Tho. Brentley hath given
granted bargained sold and confirmed to the said James J. Williams his heirs &c
his entire growing crop for the present year, One Table, six chairs one long Queen size
two chairs one side board, three bread trays, two water pails, one tin steamer, one
Linen case basket, one spinning wheel, one gun, two pots, one tea kettle, one soap
and salt stick, one pair bellows, one Shillet, one gimboree, one axe, one coil pitchfork
one handspike, one ten and one half pound iron horse. To have and to hold to the fourth
and behalf of him the said Jas. J. Williams his heirs &c upon further trust
the said Tho. Brentley being desirous to retain the aforesaid granted one, hereby
intended to be granted property in quiet and peaceable possession until default
be made the payment of the aforesaid sum of twenty two dollars and fifty cents
when in the whole or in part and then upon further trust that he soon as default
be made of the payment of the aforesaid debt, then the said Jas. J. Williams his
heirs &c at the request of the said John Gwaltney his heirs &c shall expose the
aforesaid granted or twenty intended to be granted property to public sale after
giving legal notice and not of the proceeds arising from such sale pay the
