This Indenture made and entered into this 8th day of August on thousand eight hundred and forty three, between Thomas Brantly of the first part, James J. Williams of the second part, and John Swalley of the third part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereas the said Thos Brantly is justly indebted to the said John Swalley in the just and full sum of twenty two dollars and fifty cents due by note bearing date July 15th 1843, of the said Thos Brantly being willing, and desiring to secure the payment of the aforesaid debt. Now this indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises also for the sum of one dollar to the said Thomas Brantly to him in hand paid by the said Jas J. Williams and before the sealing and delivering the premises the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that the said Thos Brantly hath given granted bargained sold and conveyed to the said James J. Williams his heirs &c his entire garving crop for the present year, one Table, two chairs one bed furniture two chests, one cabinet, three broad trays, two water pails, one tin stovener, one broom and shovel one spinning wheel, one gun two pots, one tin kettle one bag anvilstick, one pair of scales, one shill, one gunther, one axe one coal shovel one hand saw, one cow and calf, and one horse. To have and to hold to the said James J. Williams his heirs &c upon further trust use and behoof of him the said Jas J. Williams his heirs &c upon further trust the said Thos Brantly being desirous to retain the aforesaid granted or hereby intended to be granted property in quiet and peaceable possession until default be made the payment of the aforesaid sum of twenty two dollars and fifty cents within the whole or in part and then upon further trust that if once as default be made the payment of the aforesaid debt, then the said Jas J. Williams his heirs &c at the request of the said John Swalley his heirs &c shall after the aforesaid granted or hereby intended to be granted property to public sale after giving legal notice and out of the proceeds arising from such sale pay the
