This Deed of bargain and sale from Joseph Weston Jr. Esq. To Jonathan T. Griffin of the second part and William Vick of the third part last made witness that the said John Vick and Parker Vick are jointly indebted to him the said Mr. Weston in the sum of one hundred and Twenty Dollars appearing unto by note or bills indented each of which of your date, together with the interest which shall accrue thereon from the date hereof until said sum be paid, also the costs of I. T. Griffin in every respect of carrying this instrument into full effect, and the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid to the said John & Parker Vick by the aforesaid J. Griffin at or before the execution and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that the said John & Parker Vick have bargained & sold and by these presents with quiet enjoyment and all with the said J. T. Griffin the following several property to wit, the present growing crop of wheat, Indian corn, & other grain which crop was raised by them the said John & Parker Vick on the land of said Vick, also one horse, and sixteen head of hogs, £100.00, and to hold the above named crop of one of house and hogs with all the right title interest and estate to both crops & stock, flocks and herds to him the said J. T. Griffin his heirs and assigns forever. It is further moreover stipulated that the said J. T. Griffin shall at the request of either of the other parties above named shall as soon as he conveniently can after giving ten or more days previous notice of the time and place due the above named crop, horses, and hogs for sale and out of the same first pay the said interest thrice and then pay and discharge the above named debt of one hundred and Twenty dollars with the interest which shall have accrued thereon and if such money remain in the hands of the said J. T. Griffin the same shall be given to his representative paid over to them the said John and Parker Vick to each an equal sum & to such other persons or persons as shall or may be legally entitled to receive the same.
