This Indenture, made this the 25th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four, between Phineas M Bailey and his wife Evelina B. of the County of James the first part; Thomas S. Purdey of the County of Southampton of the second part, and Jane M. Purdey of the third part; and all of the State of Virginia. Whereas the said Phineas M. Bailey is justly indebted unto sum of nine hundred and fifty dollars to the said Jane M. Purdey due this day next, fully appear by affixing to a bond bearing witness unto this Indenture which debt with the legal interest thereon amounting they the said Phineas M. Bailey & Evelina B. being are willing and desirous to secure. Now this Indenture witnesseth that we are in consideration of the premises and also for the further satisfaction of one dollar of legal money of Virginia to them the said Phineas M. Bailey & Evelina B. his wife in part by the said Phineas S. Purdey at and before the sealing and delivery of this present indenture is hereby acknowledged. In the said Phineas M. Bailey and Evelina his wife which gives granted long since sold above mentioned instrument of payment of the sum aforesaid debt given grantee herein wills, desire and requires the said Phineas S. Purdey his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land which they the said Phineas M. Bailey and his wife Evelina B. recently made a containing three hundred and eighty two acres to the same manor of New Kent lying and being the County of Southampton and State of Virginia and bounded by the lands lying to the following persons, to wry. On the North by the lands belonging to Robert Estall on the East by the lands belonging to James B. Neagley, his Esqre, his plantation on the South by the lands belonging to George B. Colleman, John Neagley, Jr. and Joshua Estall, on the West by the lands belonging to the heirs of Major Edward Bailey and Thomas Atherton and the lands belonging to the heirs of St. George Estall & to wry the plantation on which El. W. Bailey resided at the time of his death with all his appurtenances to the said tract of land belonging or in any wise appertaining, and all the estate, right, title of interest of the said Phineas M. Bailey and his wife Evelina B. in and to the said lands granted or intended to be hereby granted, that is parcel of land and premises, to have and to hold the said lands granted or intended to be hereby granted tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances unto the said Jane M. Burton her heirs, executors, administrators or assigns forever upon Trust. Nevertheless to the said Phineas S. Purdey his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns may and shall at any time, upon the request of the said Jane M. Burton her executors, administrators or assigns and shall the said land and premises to the highest bidder furnish money at public auction after giving thirty days written notice of the time and place of sale to public a New Bedford and also advertising the same in the Amherst and the County of Southampton and also in sundry other public places thirty days previous to the day of sale. And out of the money arising from such sale shall after satisfying the debt of and all other expenses attending the premises, pay to the said Jane M. Burton her executors, administrators or assigns the debt of interest before mentioned of the couple of years pay of return to the said Phineas M. Bailey & Evelina B. by the said Jane M.
