This Indenture made and entered into this 25<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1803 between Sittilton R. Edwards of the one part and John M. Burley of the other part, who John A. Burley is in order to secure and provide for the payment of certain sums of money due from him to Osceola Burley by an Indenture bearing date the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January in the year 1800, and admitted to Record on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of March 1803, the same to the said Sittilton R. Edwards his or her other property, one certain tract or parcels of land containing six hundred and ninety four acres more or less being the same tract of land which the said Burley purchased of Edwards Burley and wife Y. Reed dated 18<sup>th</sup> January 1802. In Trust nevertheless and with power and authority to the said Sittilton R. Edwards to sell the same for the purpose of paying the said sum of money mentioned in said tract and the expenses attending the execution of the said tract in case the said John A. Burley should fail to discharge the debt as they respectively became due and whereas the said John A. Burley having failed to pay and discharge the debt so said failing become due on the said Edwards Burley in consequence thereof agreed to sell of the said tract of land to remeade for the purpose of reward. So said Sittilton Edwards in execution of the said tract (after giving reasonable public notice thereof) did on this day set up and sell at public auction to the highest bidder on the premises for cash the said tract of land with the improvements and appurtenances, and at the same time the aforesaid John M. Burley became the purchaser by bidding therefor sum of fifteen hundred and five dollars being the highest bid made for the same. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Sittilton R. Edwards for and in consideration of the said sum of fifteen hundred and five dollars to him by the said John M. Burley in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by him granted his and will and by these presents does grant bargain sell and convey unto the said John M. Burley his heirs and assigns the same tract of land herein before mentioned described with the improvements theron and the appurtenances thereto belonging. To have and hold the said tract of land with the improvements theron and appurtenances thereto belonging, and all the other right title and interest of the said Sittilton R. Edwards therein unto the said John M. Burley his heirs and assigns to his and their sole profit and behove forever. And the said Sittilton R. Edwards for having by his heirs and assigns hereby consented to and with the said John M. Burley his heirs and assigns that he will forever warrant and defend the said tract of land hereby conveyed with the improvements theron and the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said John M. Burley his heirs and assigns against the claim of him the said Sittilton R. Edwards and all persons claiming the same in any part thereof by through or under him or against the claim of no other person whomsoever. In witness whereof the said Sittilton R. Edwards hath countersigned his hand and affixed his seal this the 25<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1803.
