 our hundred and forty three. The Conditions of the above obligation is such that
 whereas Thomas Butler who is the debtor of Ann Butler de^d has this day paid into
 the above named Justice Ann Butler (who is one of the distributees of the aforesaid
 Ann Butler de^d) the sum of seven hundred & forty seven dollars and eight pence
 Six hundred & fifty dollars and thirty five cents of which is the amount principal and
 interest up to this day due by the County Court to & payable to the said Justice
 out of such & Butlers portion of Ann Butler estate the said Sarah Butler having
 been adjudged one of the distributees of the said Ann Butler de^d and the other thirty
 seven dollars and forty six cents being the balance in full principal and interest
 up to this day due the said R S Butlers as one of the distributees of Ann Butler
 as will appear by a reference to the Master's Commissioners report. These Things of the
