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This Indenture made and entered into this 18th day of September
one thousand eight hundred and forty three between Benjamin Whifield of the County
of Southampton and state of Virginia of the first part, Frederick Hobbs of the second
part and Abram Riddick of the third part both of Stamford City N.C., witnesseth
that whereas Benjamin Whifield is indebted to Abram Riddick in the sum of two
hundred dollars one dollar 16^{1/2} due by land bearing date Sept^r 1840 also
one other note of five hundred and fourteen dollars 75⁰⁰ bearing date Sept^r
18th 1843 which debt the said Whifield is willing and desirous to pay to the said
Abram Riddick and is also willing and desires to serve him harmly and free
from damage by reason of these several conveyances. Now this Indenture witnesseth
that for and in consideration of the premises and the sum of one hundred dollars to him in
hand paid by Frederick Hobbs trustee, the receipt of which I do hereby acknowl-
edge I the said Benjamin Whifield hath given quitclaim bargained and sold
unto the said Hobbs the following property viz One tract or parcel of land lying being
in the said County and state containing six hundred and thirty four acres more or less
adjoining the lands of John C. Hale West Sth Brown his brother, one large tree old
my arbor, three horses, twelve head of cattle, thirty head of sheep, five head of hogs, five
beds, bedding and furniture, one buffet, one desk, chairs, chest and all my other house-
hold furniture all my cooking utensils, kitchen furniture together with all my farming
utensils, working tools &c One hundred & six Cow, two thousand pounds black gold double
fordol, pens potatoes, cotton & two barrels Apple Brandy, together with all else of
my property not especially named in this article, and all property in my possession at the
time of sale. Now the condition of this obligation is such that if the said Benjamin
Whifield shall in the first day of Jan^r January hereafter, pay to the said Abram Riddick
an amount sufficient to reduce the two named debts one hundred dollars to the said
Benjamin Whifield is to remain in quiet possession of all the aforesaid property herein named
or intended to be conveyed, but on the failure of said Whifield to reduce the named
debt one hundred dollars, on or before the first day of January the first, or in case the property may be
considered by the said Riddick to be wanting or left wanting in value it is then and not
until then that the said Riddick, may require the said Hobbs trustee to sell whereupon
he shall if required by the said Riddick advertise the time place of sale, and proceed
to sell all the named property, convey and all such as may be found in possession
of the said Benjamin Whifield and first take out all the expenses then pay to the said
Riddick the balance due on the two named debts, and the balance of any money
over to the said Benjⁱ Whifield. In witness the several parties have affixed their
names over the day of date before written.
