Eighteen hundred and forty three, Between Benjamin Whitfield of the first

Brill is in violent circumstances and his wife the daughter of said Benjamin
Whitfield is liable to suffer for the maintenance of life and her father having recently
arrived to some to be treated for her sole benefit some property

Now this Indenture Witnesseth: That for and in consideration of the natural
love and affection which said Benjamin Whitfield bears to his said daughter and
the wife of James Brill as well as the further consideration of our duty to her in
having paid by the said Wella Whitfield Trustee before this writing and delivery of the
premises the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged: the said Benjamin Whitfield
has given granted sold and by these presents doth give grant sell and
convey unto him the said Wella Whitfield Trustee his heirs and assigns from the
following property (to wit) one feather bed Bed six and furniture on that
one looking glass and two trunks: To have and to hold the said property to her
the said Wella Whitfield Trustee and her heirs forever: Upon trust that she shall for
the following purpose that is to say: that the said Wella Whitfield Trustee shall
hold the said property for the sole and separate use of Nancy Brill wife of James
Brill and permit her to enjoy the same free from the claim and demands and
