This Indenture made this 23rd day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three between Edward Beaton of the first part John Booth of the second part and Nathaniel T. Williams of the third part: whereas the said Edward Beaton is greatly indebted to the said N. T. Williams in the sum of five hundred dollars due the 25th day of October 1843 by him also to the said N. T. Williams is security for the said Edward Beaton to Nathaniel Franklin for the sum of four hundred fifty dollars due the 25th day of Sept 1843 which debt (with the legal interest thereon accruing) the said Edward Beaton is willing and anxious to secure: Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the promises and also for the further Consideration of one dollar to the said Edward Beaton in hand paid by the said John Booth at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Edward Beaton hath given granted Bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released and Confirmed and by these presents hath given grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release and Confirm to the said John Booth his heirs and assigns forever: all that tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia containing Two hundred and forty acres lie the same more or less and bounded as follows: Separated by the flat bounds from the lands of Henry Hunter & Evans Bryant beginning at the Sence of John Rochester Savion Beale & others known by the name of Bryant's also Regis man Ninge, few less of miles. Two less of horse one wagon and harness the feather bed furniture one Clock one Chest of drawers one round table Corp of Corn fodder feed fed pasture two Carts & wheels one month or thirty bushel of hay I then remeant all my household and Kitchen furnitures with all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract of land belonging even any water appertaining, and all the estate right title and interest of the said Edward Beaton in and to the said grant or interest to his heirs granted tract of land and premises: To have and to hold the said hereby granted or intimated to his hereby granted tract of land & premises with its appurtenances together with the aforesaid slave and all the other personal property hereby Conveyed unto the said John Booth his heirs Executors administrators and
