 acknowledged: I the said John R. Rochelle have granted Bargain and Sale

 I & R. James all of my interest in the above Negroes of Mrs. Anna Bailey the
 account stated a Negro Man by the Name of John and a Negro woman by the Name
 of Leah and her Child Herod one bay horse, two cows and eight
 head of Cattle and five or six
 head of Hogs

 together with all appurtenances one table and one and the whole of my
 household and kitchen furniture: also a tract of land lying at or near
 my farm called supposed to be 36 acres but the same more or less
 my interest in a tract of land in the upper part of this County lying
 the lands of Samuel Bankham and others: To have the aforesaid property
 in special trust and consideration to the intent and purpose that if upon
 the sum of one hundred eighty eight dollars and 6/10c due to Edward P. James
 also the sum of Two hundred and twenty three dollars and 4/10c due
 Wm. J. Nelson with Sampson & Pears security shall remain unpaid
 the said Edward P. James his heirs Executors administrators or assigns shall
 after giving legal notice expose the aforesaid property to public sale and
