

that whereas Peter Summerville, the ancestor of the founder of the said tract on his lifetime purchased from the said George Nelson his wife Mary who was formerly Mary Dowd one moiety of a tract of land in the County of Southampton containing by estimation one hundred and thirty eight acres and one half of an acre for the sum of one hundred dollars which purchase money was paid to the said George Nelson but no conveyance written made to the said Peter Summerville and whereas the said Nelson wife were willing now to convey to the said heirs of said Peter Summerville one moiety of the said tract of one hundred and thirty eight acres and a half acre which descended to the said Mary Nelson others or came to them by will from W^t Boykin deceased and which one hundred and thirty eight acres and half of an acre it is supposed belonged to the said George Nelson on right of his wife & Samuel Whieldon and his wife Elizabeth both of whom now being dead the said tract of land of one hundred and thirty eight acres and one half acre is bounded by the lands of Patrick Belot and the lands formerly Summerville now Councill. Now the further indenture witnesseth that the said George Nelson and his wife Mary, and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of five dollars to them in hand paid by the said W^m. H. Summerville and others heirs at law of Peter Summerville also before the sealing and delivery of this indenture the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said George Nelson and wife Mary as hereby grant bargain and convey to the said W^m. H. Summerville Recd^r Peter Summerville late of Summerville Thomas S. Summerville heirs at law of the said Peter Summerville all the right title claim in trust and demand of the said George Nelson and wife Mary in and to the said unenclosed one hundred and thirty eight acres of land. To have and to hold the said unenclosed moiety of the said land to the said W^m. H. Summerville Recd^r Peter Summerville and Thos. S. Summerville their heirs forever free from the claims of the said Nelson and wife and all persons claiming by former under them.
