the Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the said Hannibal Whitehead having conveyed to Nathaniel Francis by Deed of Gift Certain property herein mentioned upon this condition that he the said Nathaniel Francis is to furnish the said Hannibal Whitehead with a decent support & clothing Medical attendance and all other necessary things during his life Now in case the said Nathaniel Francis shall pay all necessary expenses day for day Clothing Medical aid and support the said Hannibal Whitehead during then this obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue
