Wompler hath given granted bargained sold alienated enfeoffed retained and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargained released and released and confirms to the said Patrick H. Johnson his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampford and lying on Seacock and adjoining the Lands of the Abingdon Leathers Containing by estimation one hundred & twenty five acres the same more or less also Ten Barrels Corn which is in plantation To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land so unto the said Patrick H. Johnson his heirs and assigns forever trust however that the said Patrick H. Johnson shall always so conveniently Corn after the first day of January next ensuing and having advertised the time and place of sale of the said land I Corn by several advertisements to be posted up at the most publick places in the aforesaid County and also by other advertisement to be posted up at the door of the Court house of said County on some one Court day previous to the aforesaid date when present to sell the same to the highest bidder for ready money and out of the monies arising from such sale first pay all necessary expenses attending the sale and then pay to the said George P.
