This Indenture made the 25th day of January 1743 between Susan Bann of the County of Sussex of the one part and William L. Bennett Sheriff of Southampton County of the other part: Whereas the said Susan Bann has been committed to the jail of Sussex County charged in execution by virtue of three writs of Capias ad satisfaciendum issued against her from the Clerk's office of Sussex County Court one in favor of Alexander Bacon one in favor of Alexander Paison and another in favor of Anne Chappell and the said Susan Bann desiring to be delivered from her imprisonment by taking the oaths of assent went to the said jail this day subscribed and returned in a debenture of her estate which schedule contains the following real estate to wit @ Certain tract or parcel of Land being and being in the County of Southampton containing ²⁰⁰⁰ some being the same tract or parcel of land allotted to the said Susan in the division of the real estate of her deceased Father Frederick Balle: Now Therefore this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Susan Bann in pursuance of the act of the General Assembly in such Case made and provided and for the Satisfaction of one dollar to her in hand paid by the said William L. Bennett Sheriff as aforesaid at and before the taking and delivery of these presents the said Susan Bann doth acknowledge hath granted Bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said William L. Bennett Sheriff as aforesaid all that tract or parcel of land herein before mentioned and described to her by him assigned of according to Law: and the said Susan Bann doth by these presents warrant: and defend the same to the before granted land unto the said William L. Bennett against the claims or claims of all persons whatsoever notwithstanding whereof the said Susan Bann hath hereunto set her hand and seal the say and year first above written
