 that whereas Spurrier Williams on the 25th day of January 1843 being committed
 to the jail of Suffolk County charged in trespass by reason of three suits of
 Capital damages & damages filed against him one in favor of Alexander T. Day
 one in favor of Alexander Faxon & the other in favor of John Chappell did not
 then taking the same of an insolvent debtor by due duly executed and returned in
 pursuance of the act of the General Assembly in such case made and provided
 Convey to the aforesaid Williams L^r Edwards Sheriff of Southampton County a tract
 of land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing
 acres being the same tract or parcel of land allotted to the said Person
 the division of the real estate of his deceased father Benjamin Davis to be by
 him the said Person, desirous of according to law and justice as the said Court
 Sheriff in pursuance of the act of aforesaid in such case made and provided
 after giving due and legal Notice thereof did on the 20th day of November 1843
 being Southampton Court day before the grand jury of the County of Southampton
