

to wit, I admit, or the heirs, executors, administrators of either of them within the said Chancery shall take possession of the same and sell the said slaves & increase to the highest bidder either for cash or on such credit as may be agreed by the said parties of the short part after having advertised the same & place of said sale for at least one month as the Court have set off the County in which said slave may then reside & at 2 or more public places in the neighborhood of said sale and out of the proceeds first pay the expenses of sales according to the said County pay the debt to which the said George B. Buell & Smith are the debtors and the debt due to the said Wm. Abenethy admr. as aforesaid together with all the interest which may have accrued thereon & finally pay the bond due to the said Mason of one hundred & twenty nine dollars & 78 cents together with the interest on the same to which there is no security & should there be any balance remaining in the hands of the said Chancery after paying the above debts & interest pay the same over to the said Bond or his order but should the said Bond pay the said debts together with all the interest due thereon & the costs of recording this and before a sale of said property is made then this instrument is to be void and testimony whereof the said parties have hereunto set their hands & seals the day & year first herein written
