acknowledge themselves fully and amply satisfied and paid back greatest bargain
and sold above enfranchised and confirmed are by these presents both great bargain
and sell unto the said John Compton to him and to his heirs forever one certain
tract or parcel of land (called Bowings old place) situated lying and being in
the County aforesaid Containing by estimation one hundred acres to the same more or
less and bounded as follows (viz) beginning at Blanks Corner bridge thence of
the New road to the road leading from Blanks water bridge to Blanks old tavern
thence up said road to Broadshaws Mill over thence down said run to the
bridge first mentioned together with all houses out houses out buildings
yards gardens orchards ways water water courses whatsoever belonging or
